From artifacts to sustainable architecture, bamboo remains a favourite as it's fast to grow, low on maintenance.



There are at least 16,000 types of trees that grow in the Amazon rainforest. For years, scientists thought South America didn't have very tall trees. They believed the highest ones reached about 196 feet. Experts recently visited the rainforest. They measured trees up to about 290 feet tall. That's taller than a 25-storeyed building! People thought that trees in the Amazon don't grow this tall.

SALAR DE UYUNI

Ever dreamt of a walk in the clouds? Well, your dreams can come true at the Salar De Uyuni in Bolivia, South America. It is home to the world's biggest salt flat. Salar De Uyuni is the remains of a prehistoric (very old) lake that dried off. It left behind space of bright-white salt, rock formations, and cacti-islands. Large flocks of beautiful pink Flamingos can be seen here grazing in the water.



GRÜNER SEE SEE (GREEN LAKE)

Green Lake is one of the most "exotic" (extraordinary) waters to dive in and around Europe. This is because of an uncommon natural phenomenon: In March as summer begins, the snow melts from the mountains. Slowly the water level in the lake rises. The freshwater from it floods the valley. It covers small paths and trees. In June, the lake becomes an amazing lagoon (bay). The lake then reaches a maximum depth of 12 meters. Hence gulping down high trees, a bridge and even benches.



VINICUNCA RAINBOW MOUNTAIN

The Rainbow Mountain is a colorful peak in Peru. It is also known as Vinicunca or Montaña de Siete Colores. This mountain is covered in broad lines of pastel blue, dark red, green, pink and yellow colors. As of now, science is not able to find the reason for this natural wonder.



SPOTTED LAKE KHILUK

Spotted Lake Khiluk located in Canada is the most mineralized (full of added minerals) lake in the world. The lake is seen with 365 separate pools. These pools are arranged in a mosaic-like pattern (a picture or pattern produced by arranging together small pieces of stone, tile, glass, etc.) Each of these spots has special and strong liquid chemicals in it. These cure different diseases.

NUTTELA - A SPREAD & SMILE AT MEAL TIME

We all love Nutella. You can put it inside crepes or on the top of waffles, or eat it straight out of the jar with a spoon. Every year Italians consume at least 60 million jars of Nutella!

But where did this tempting spread come from?

The history of Nutella is an inspiring tale of love and passion.



Nutella was invented by Pietro Ferrero in 1964. A pastry chef in Turin, Italy, Pietro. He used to watch factory workers carry bread with tomatoes and cheese for a meal. He thought of giving those workers a more appetizing option.

Pietro Ferrero, created a sweet paste made from hazelnuts, sugar and just a little cocoa. It was a cheaper alternative to chocolate, which was in short supply. Luckily, hazelnuts were easily available. The product came as a solid block called pasta Gianduja which could be sliced and served on bread, but later on, it was also sold as a spreadable paste called Supercrema.



In 1962, Italy passed a law banning names with superlatives (such as super-, ultra-, stra-) for consumer products. Ferrero had to choose a new brand name – Nutella.



The Nutella name comes from combining the English word 'nut' and the Latin suffix for sweetness – 'ella'.

Italy soon fell in love with Nutella. It became so popular with time that at the start of 2015, one jar of Nutella was sold every 2.5 seconds worldwide.

Like Coca-Cola and other companies, Ferrero has a secret recipe, carefully protected in the official factory in Alba.

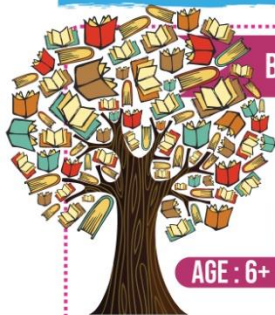

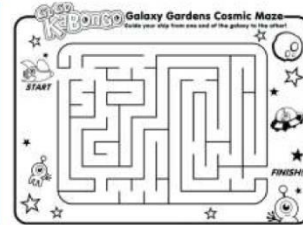
